Can I swim here? Water quality testing resumes for safe summer swimming at your favourite local spots

Every week from 1 November through to the end of March, Taranaki Regional Council (TRC) checks the quality of popular recreational rivers, beaches, and lakes in Taranaki to report if the water's safe for swimming.

Before you and your animals jump in the water, visit **TRC.govt.nz/Can-I-Swim-Here** to make sure the water quality is safe. Water that's contaminated with bacteria can make you and your pets sick and that won't make for nice summer fun!

In addition to checking TRC's website, it's always good to look out for these things before plunging in:

- Has it rained heavily in the last three days? Rain water can wash contaminants into the water, so it's best not to swim for two or three days after prolonged or heavy rain.
- Is the water murky or cloudy? That can be a sign that it's not safe for swimming. Come back when the water clears.
