Our big audit of bins is underway

Our waste minimisation team is doing an audit of residential bins. This work will help us identify which bins we need to repair or replace, how many bins are out there, and if they're the right type. It's also important for future work, like our plans to add a unique code to bins so we can return them if lost.

When checking your bins, our team will wear their signature high-fashion, high-visibility gear, with visible ID, and all mahi will be done during working hours.

There are over 8,500 bins to look at and the audit will take months' of work in sun, wind, and rain, so don't feel shy about saying kia ora. It'll make their day.

Plants or branches overhanging your boundary? Time to trim!

The summer weather's been great for the garden, but new growth can be an issue when vegetation overhangs the footpath or road. This can make it hard for little kids on scooters, parents with prams, people with accessibility needs or sight impairments, and your local postie to get around your street safely.

Please check our rules for overhanging vegetation and trim back any problem plants. If you notice trees or vegetation are affecting your safe use of footpaths or roads, please contact us on 06 765 6099, email StratfordDC@stratford.govt.nz, or make a report using our free Antenno App.

POOTPATH Regint clearance above carriageway and 0.5m behind the kerb CARRIAGEWAY

What are the rules?

- If the footpath is next to a private property boundary, all vegetation should be trimmed back to the boundary (including hedges) so the entire footpath width is clear of vegetation.
- A clear space of 2.5 metres above the footpath, berm or walkway is required.
- A clear space of 4.5 metres above the road to allow truck or bus clearance is required.
- Where there is only a grass berm, clearance of overhanging vegetation is required to allow safe access for users.
