### Addition to proposed temporary road closures - North Island Rally Series

On 17 April, Stratford District Council (SDC) published a Public Notice proposing the temporary closure of Cheal, Wingrove, Waihapa, Bird, Mohakau, Makuri, Stanley, Douglas, Waiwiri, and Croydon Roads on Sunday 7 July between the hours of 6am and 4pm for the 2024 North Island Rally Series. After an arborist inspection, two notable trees on Hamlet Street have been confirmed as being infected with Ganoderma Brackets otherwise known as white

Unfortunately, because the infection is known to weaken trees through damaging the internal structure, the arborist recommended the two trees be removed. This will take place between Monday 13 and Friday 17 of May.

We'll replace the trees like-for-like, and we hope the new additions will one day grow up to be notable too.
