Make sure you register

You'll need to register for some of our activities. Please do it early so you don't miss out. You can register online at Eventbrite.co.nz or at the Stratford Library and Visitor Information Centre and Wai O Rua - Stratford Aquatic Centre.

Is your kiddo 8 years old or under?

Children 8 years and under have to be actively supervised by a caregiver 16 years old or over for all of our activities.

At Wai O Rua - Stratford Aquatic Centre, there must be at least 1 adult supervisor to 3 children under the age of 8. If a caregiver is supervising more than one child under the age of 8, all children have to be in the same pool. Full supervision rules are on **page 14**.

Get creative with what's around the whare!

Make your own little Christmas tree with pegs and cardboard, and then decorate it. You can even make a whole forest of trees. Who knows? Maybe Santa will leave tiny presents under your little Christmas trees too?!

Step 1 - find pegs

Find a peg for each tree you're making. The best pegs to use are the ones that are spring-loaded, so they'll hold on to the tree part. Don't take all your grown-up's pegs though. You want to make sure they still have enough to wash and dry all your clothes.

Step 2 - cut out triangles for the trees

You can use green card (like in the picture) or any card you have around the house and colour it. Carefully cut out your triangles - get a hand from a grown-up if you need it. If you're making heaps of trees, try making some wide and some tall. Which do you like best?

Step 3 - time to decorate!

What can you find or make to decorate your tree? You could use coloured paper, buttons, shiny bits of foil from food wrappers, things from nature you find outside, string for tinsel, just to name a few options. Use double-sided tape or glue to stick them on. Try not to make your decorations too heavy, so your tree will stand upright. Once you're done, find a nice home for your trees.

Idea: Make Strawberry Santas



Step 1 - cut your strawberry

Saturday 18 January 10am - 4pm


Make it easy! Book the bus leaving Stratford at 10am and returning back at 3pm

Pool supervision rules

- 5 years and under must have a caregiver over 16 years of age in the pool within arms reach.
- 6-8 years must be actively supervised by a caregiver over 16 years of age.
- There must be a minimum of 1 adult supervisor to 3 children under the age of 8.
- If a caregiver is supervising more than one child under the age of 8, then all children must be in the same pool.
